Tom's Thoughts

A NOTE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

This summer I have delighted in a class I have been leading on reaching out to the unchurched. We have based our discussions on a book written by Bill Hybels entitled "Just Walk Across the Room". We have been inspired and challenged in the same breath. Hybels encourages us all to simply "walk across the room" when it comes to building relationships and engaging others regarding their walk with Christ.

He calls us to live what he calls, "3-D Lives". By "3-D Lives," Hybels means living in such a way where we are constantly "developing friendships, discovering stories and discerning next steps."

By so doing we need to stay attuned to God's Spirit and cooperate with the same. We need to constantly keep our eyes and ears open, making ourselves available to every opportunity to help someone along toward a spiritual awakening. As with the Apostle Paul we need to recognize that God has a mystical ability to draw people to himself. It was Paul who recognized his place in all of this. "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase." (I Corinthians 3:6)

Hybels gives some helpful hints as we prepare to share our own stories of how God through Christ has made a difference. He says, "Don't be long-winded." Hybels says that our story needs to be condensed to around a hundred words. He encourages clarity. "Fuzziness" only breeds confusion. "Speak simply," he says. The use of religionese serves only to turn off those who might otherwise listen. "Stay humble." An air of superiority will drive people away.

In our every effort at reaching out to the unchurched, may we all take these words to heart as we seek to make good on Christ's mandate to "go into all the world and make disciples."
