

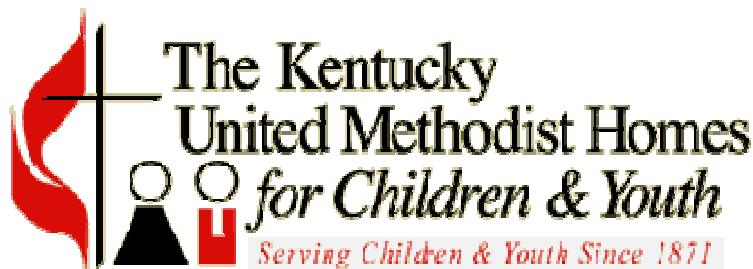

From Pastor Gary...

Let's take one last look at 2010. It was a year of great celebrations and great challenges. We celebrate the planting of Revolution Church. The planting of a new church is a continuation of a long tradition of St. Paul planting churches locally and globally. Revolution Church will help keep The United Methodist Church strong in Louisville for generations to come. We celebrate the many ministries here at St. Paul. VBS was the largest in our history with over 200 kids participating. We had a successful music camp, basketball camp, youth choir tour, youth mission trips, Upward Basketball, Metamorphosis, KICS, Bible studies, and the list goes on. Our worship is second to none and we celebrate the inspiring worship that our leaders provide. We celebrate the ongoing mission work of individuals and groups locally and globally. There was much about 2010 to celebrate.

The year also had its challenges. The missionaries who went to plant Revolution Church created some gaps in leadership for us. We also had challenges in the area of staff leadership. We had some staff changes, we had staff out due to illness, and we were without an Associate Pastor for the last six months.

However, out of the challenges came other reasons to celebrate. Many of you served and gave of your time in the midst of leadership and staff shortages. Many more of you offered to serve wherever you were needed. Even with the loss of income from the missionaries who went to Revolution, we still received \$1,212,516.63 in offerings and we finished the year with a \$11,000.61 surplus. Thank you for your generosity of time and resources. St. Paul is a great church because of you. Thanks!

Walk to Jerusalem

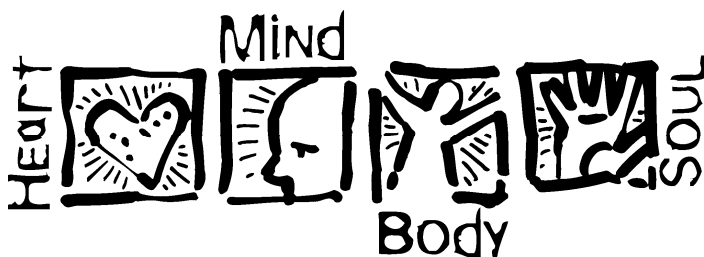
Mark your calendars!

Introducing a new column from the Spiritual Formation Team:

Knowing God

This team is just beginning to define its mission, but we would like to be a resource for the St. Paul congregation as we grow together in our Christian journey.

In each edition of *The Tower*, we will offer suggestions for books to read, websites to explore, spiritual disciplines to try, ancient/new ways to pray, or fresh opportunities to experience God's presence.

A foundational book in the area of spiritual formation is Richard Foster's *Celebration of Discipline—The Path to Spiritual Growth*. Though it was originally published in 1978, it continues to be a wonderful introduction to both individual and communal practices, such as silence, simplicity, prayer, fasting, study of Scripture, and service. Copies are available at the public library and one or two at St. Paul. Foster says, "The grace of God is unearned and unearnable, but if we ever expect to grow in grace, we must pay the price of a consciously chosen course of action which involves both individual and group life. Spiritual growth is the purpose of the Disciplines."

New Year, New Habits

The power of family nights

The power of family nights is two-fold. First, it creates a formal setting within which parents can intentionally instill beliefs, values or character qualities within their child. Rather than defer to the influence of peers and media, or leave the training to the school and church, parents create the opportunity to teach their children the things that matter most.

The second impact is perhaps even more significant than the first. Twenty to sixty minutes of formal fun and instruction can set up countless opportunities for informal reinforcement. Once you have formally discussed a given family night topic, you and your children will naturally refer back to those principles during the routine conversations of everyday life.

Family nights can be a wonderful complement to or replacement for family devotions as a means of passing their beliefs and values to the kids.

KY Methodist Homes for Children

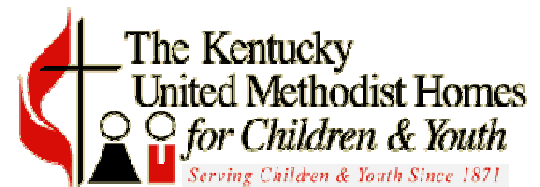
On January 30th, St. Paul will take the first of four Fifth Sunday offerings in 2011 for the Kentucky United Methodist Homes for Children and Youth.

This year the Methodist Homes celebrate 140 years of care for children and youth. In March 1871, the Kentucky Legislature authorized the Kentucky and Louisville Methodist Conferences to establish a "Widows' and Orphans' Home." The first building to house children in this ministry was located at 812 South Fifth Street in Louisville. In 1931, the staff and 56 children were moved to the newly purchased campus in Versailles. In 1984, the Mary Kendall Home in Owensboro was acquired, renovated, and expanded to care for additional children and youth in the western part of the state. We gratefully celebrate and honor those groups and individuals who had the vision, concern and gave generously of their time and resources through the years. Their dedication to create and maintain homes of care, hope, and healing for children has indeed been a labor of love.

In 2009, St. Paul's Fifth Sunday offering totaled \$7,195.19, the largest amount in recent years. In 2010, our total giving was \$6,424.64. This information was supplied by the Home and Mr. Cleve Iler, Financial Administrator at St. Paul. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Let us celebrate the 140 years of service to children with an offering as generous as permitted by our individual circumstances.

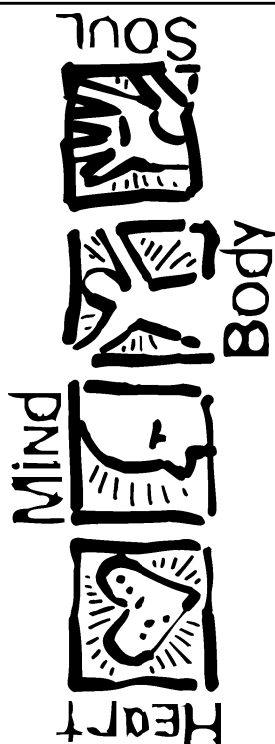
