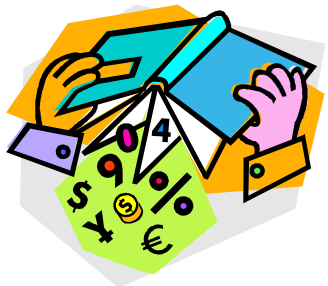

GARY'S THOUGHTS

In most every profession or institution the people "in the know" frequently believe everyone is "in the know." However, as we all know, this is not true. The church is no different, often staff and team leaders believe everyone knows what is going on in their area. I would like to help you better understand some areas of our church. There are four Administrative Teams and the Administrative Council. I will describe the functions of each of these teams. You can find the people who serve on each of these teams in the green St. Paul telephone Directory.

Board of Trustees: The major responsibility of the Trustees is to care for the property. If anything needs to be built, remodeled, maintained, or repaired the Trustees are responsible. In some cases, the Trustees are responsible for managing any bequest left to the church. However, like most churches, St. Paul's Trustees have given that responsibility to the Stewardship and Finance Team. The Trustees is the one team where you do not have to be a church member to be on the team. One-third of the Trustees must be women. The Trustees have no set schedule for meetings.

Personnel Team: The Personnel Team a.k.a., The Staff-Parish Committee, is responsible for personnel matters. Their primary responsibility is to support the staff and assist them in being a success. They are responsible for hiring and, if necessary, terminating lay staff and ordained Deacons. They make recommendations to the Bishop on whether appointed clergy (Elders) should be reappointed or moved. Setting salaries is a part of their annual duties. They will set the lay staff and ordained Deacon salaries and recommend to the Charge Conference appointed clergy salaries. The Personnel Team has no set schedule for meetings.

Stewardship and Finance Team: The Stewardship and Finance Team manage the finances of the church. They monitor income and expenses and make recommendations accordingly. They set the annual budget. The normal meeting schedule is second Tuesday of odd numbered months at 6:00 PM.

The Lay Ministry Team: The Lay Ministry Team's major responsibility is to make nominations for the church officers. The nominations then go to the Charge Conference for final approval. The Team does its work in October and November.

The Administrative Council: The Administrative Council is the governing body for the church. The Administrative Council is made up of the chairpersons of the Administrative and Ministry Teams and Members-at-Large. All administrative and ministry teams report to the Administrative Council. The Council has final approval on all matters, except for the items that go to the Charge Conference. The Administrative Council meets the second Tuesday of odd numbered months at 7:00 PM. All meetings, except for Personnel Team meetings, are open to anyone. If you have an interest, you are welcome to attend. Also, if you are interested in serving on one of Teams, please fill out a Servant Ministry Interest form. The Lay Ministry Team will be beginning its work very soon.

Fifth Sunday Offering

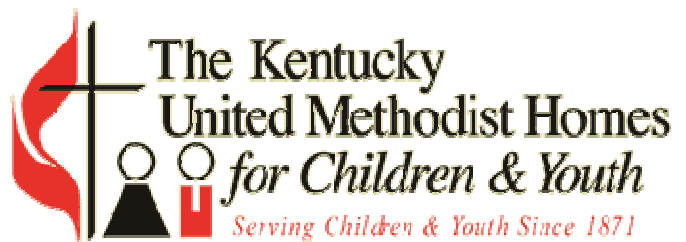

This month the St. Paul Christian Literary Study Group was delighted to have Rev. Ron Sauer, Minister of Pastoral Care, to review his book, Honoring Our Elders in Today's Church. In his presentation of insightful and practical ways to convey this honor to elders in our churches, he also spoke of how he had been mentored by older adults as a youth in a United Methodist Church in Southern Indiana, and the profound effect it had on his life and ministry. We are grateful that over 16 years of his ministry has been at St. Paul.

So, perhaps you are asking, "Do these comments about Rev. Sauer's relate to the Fifth Sunday offering?"

To me, they do. Upon reflection, I coveted the blessing of mentoring for the at-risk children and youth served by our Methodist Homes. The mentoring for them must be done by professional staff and caregivers who provide guidance for each child's specific needs. Financially, it is unlikely that many of us will ever know the recipients of our *Fifth Sunday* gifts. However, it may be likely that throughout their lives, many of the children will remember Kentucky Methodists with gratitude and honor because of the mentoring made possible, in part, by the *Fifth Sunday* offerings. Portland Promise Center—Book Drive

One of the great pleasures in life is exposing a child to the world of books. It is not hard to imagine that many children in families at St. Paul have had access to books since they were toddlers. Some may have started school knowing how to read. There is no better way to insure a child's success in school than providing access to books and having families read together. The educational research is very clear that most children who are below reading level by third grade never catch up.

St. Paul is sponsoring a new outreach ministry and partnership with the Portland Promise Center to support their work with Portland families in the area of education. Brad Matthews has agreed to be the facilitator of that effort. They currently provide educational programs and tutoring for elementary, middle, and high school students and are in need of more books at all three levels.

Revolution Church is beginning this effort next week as one of their *Promise Fest* goals by having children bring a children's book as their admission to the fall festival. In November, St. Paul will launch a book drive to broaden that support and you can participate in several ways:

Donation of Quality Used Books

Collecting boxes will be established in several places around the church for you to deposit used children and juvenile level books. These books will be reviewed for reading level and taken to the Portland Promise Center for use in their programs including giveaways to support family literacy.

Donation of New Children's Books

New children and juvenile books may be purchased and donated. The same collection boxes may be used.

Wesley Night Book Review Volunteer

Volunteers will be needed, periodically, to review all donated books for usability and reading level assignment. This group may also be used as an advisory group for other Portland Promise Center outreach initiatives related to education. 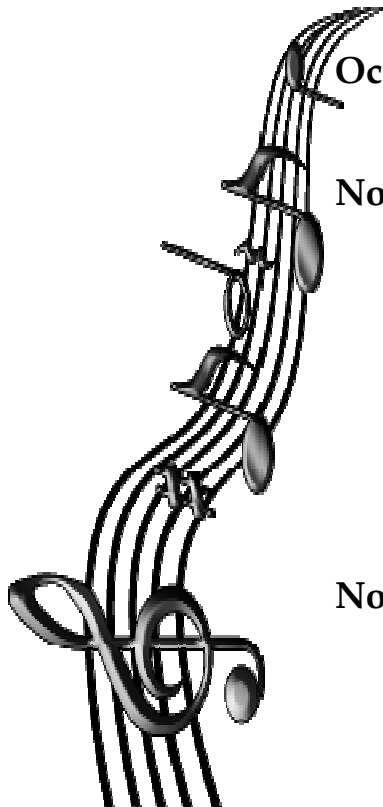
