## From the Staff

### **Karla Temple, Music Secretary, Children's Music Director**

#### **"You look like my Jesus."**

At 100 years of age, my grandmother's health was declining. Up until a few months before her 100th birthday, she had been living on her own, cooking and taking care of herself and joyfully caring for others as well. Such an amazing woman! She had lived a long and full life – serving her Lord, her family and her friends. Within her last year of life, Granny's mind had begun to slip a bit. Sometimes she didn't make much sense and couldn't remember what day it was. However, even during these times of confusion, she never forgot the important things: the names and faces of her loved ones, her favorite hymns and scriptures, how to share a hug and a kind word, and most importantly, her relationship with "her Jesus."

As she began to decline even more in the last few months of her life, my mother was by her side much of the time. One day as my mother was sitting with her, Granny had been dozing off as she often did during those months. At one point, she opened her eyes, looked at my mother for a moment and with the most peaceful smile spreading across her face she said... "You look like my Jesus." Think about those words for a moment... what a beautiful phrase! Who knows if Granny was coming out of a lovely dream, if she truly had a vision of Jesus, or if my mother simply reminded her of the character of Christ-perhaps all of the above. This precious moment will be etched in my mother's memory forever.

What about me? What about you? O, that those around us would be able to look at our lives and say "You look like my Jesus"! Could there be any higher goal? What would that kind of life look like?

My Jesus had... a gentle spirit, kind words for all he met, a true desire to please the father, grace and forgiveness for all who asked, a love abundant and overflowing, a power so great that demons trembled in his presence, a love great enough to set aside judgment as he dined and spoke with tax collectors, sinners and harlots, a look in his eyes kind enough to melt the hardest of hearts and draw people of all walks of life unto himself.

Lord, give me your eyes to see beyond the limits of humanity and into the souls of those you love. Give me your ears, your mouth, your healing hands, and a heart more like yours that I may touch lives around me for your glory. Someday may they look at my life and be able to say... " You look like my Jesus."

## Operation Christmas Child

Get your shoeboxes ready...it's time for **Operation Christmas Child!** After packing over 600 shoeboxes last year, we are busy planning another exciting year with our "Shoebox Ministry." Mark your calendar: "Blessing the Boxes" is Sunday, November 13 in the 11:00am service. OCC is a wonderful way to prepare our hearts and minds for the coming Christmas season.



### What is Operation Christmas Child?

OCC is a massive project of Samaritan's Purse that collects gift-filled shoeboxes and delivers them in the name of Jesus Christ to children in desperate situations all over the world. It is a very SIMPLE, tangible way for us to share the joy of giving and the story of Jesus with children who have never before received a gift. OCC meets one of the greatest needs of a hurting child—the need to have hope and feel loved.

### How can I get involved?

Ask God to guide you as you pack a box. Choose a boy or girl, age 2-14. Grab a shoebox and fill it with simple items that most of us would take for granted. Ideas are limitless, but some suggestions are: crayons, paper, plastic cup, bowl, a doll or plush lovey, toothbrush, socks, flip-flops, candy, toys, mittens, hats, plastic jewelry, photos & letters. Include \$7.00 to cover shipping costs, and a Gospel Story in the child's native language. Pray that the child receiving it will come to know the greatest gift of all—Jesus Christ.

### What if I don't want to pack a box?

Consider a donation to cover shipping costs for other St. Paul families, and travel expenses for missionaries who deliver the boxes by plane, train, truck, boat, even sled dogs and elephants! Checks can be made to St. Paul UMC with "Operation Christmas Child" in the memo line.

On October 30, St. Paul will take the fourth and final *Fifth Sunday Offering* of 2011 for the KY United Methodist Homes for Children and Youth. \$3,069.50 is the total collected so far this year; in 2010, the total was \$4,323.64.

# Spiritual Formation

## Knowing God

St. Teresa of Avila, who was born in 1515 and traveled throughout Spain founding seventeen Carmelite convents during her lifetime, speaks words that seem completely appropriate for our hectic lives. Here is her prayer:

*"How is it God, that you have given me this hectic life and so little time to enjoy your presence? All day, people are waiting to speak to me, and even during meals I have to keep talking to people about their concerns and needs. During sleep itself I am still thinking and dreaming about the problems that wait for me tomorrow. I am doing all this for you, not for myself. My way of life is more tormenting than reward, and I only hope that for you it is a gift of love. I know you are always beside me, yet I become so busy that I forget and ignore you. If you want me to keep up this pace, please make me think about you and love you, even during the most hectic activity. If you do not want me to be so busy, please release me from it and teach me how others can take over some of my responsibilities."*

Teresa's *Autobiography*, a classic often compared to St. Augustine's *Confessions* (in the Windsong Room), as well as her book on prayer and spiritual experience, *The Interior Castle*, are both available in the Windsong Room.

Here is her best known prayer:

**"Let nothing disturb you; nothing affright you.**

**All things are passing; God never changes.**

**Patient endurance attains all things.**

**Who God possesses in nothing is wanting.**

**Alone, God suffices."**

Many ancient practices of Christian prayer are being rediscovered today as practical ways to deepen our relationship with God. Suggestions for daily practice and weekly group experiences will be offered.
